

# **CATHOLIC Q&A**

Since it is pertinent to this season of Lent, I would like to reprint the second Q&A I ever wrote for this column, with a few minor corrections. It's about the sufferings of Christ, and Paul's words in his Letter to the Colossians:

### What does Paul mean when he says that he "completes what is lacking in Christ's afflictions" (Col 1:24-25)? I thought Jesus' work on the Cross was perfect! What could anyone do that Jesus hasn't already done for us?

This is a very good question, and I think, one of the great mysteries of Scripture. What you have to ask yourself is this: What could still be lacking in the sufferings of Christ? He suffered to the fullest extent, and for all mankind. This work is called the "objective redemption," and the degree, or quality, or completeness of it has no imperfection.

But, there is still something lacking. What is still required is *the application of the grace of the Cross upon us*. He won all the grace through his perfect suffering, but this grace must still be applied to us. This application is called the "subjective redemption." Any time we celebrate any of the sacraments, the grace of the Cross is applied to us and we experience this redemption. We know that it is necessary because if it wasn't, then everyone would have been instantly saved as soon as Jesus said, "It is finished." But, we're not.

So, we have thus far established what is lacking. The grace of the Cross must still be applied to us. Now, Paul tells us in the passage you are quoting that one way to make up for what is lacking (to apply the grace of the Cross to men) is by taking up our Cross just as Jesus Christ took up His. Suffering for the sake of the Body is meritorious. It is a good deed that is rewarded by grace, and all such deeds serve to build up the Body of Christ.

This explains why Paul would *rejoice* in his sufferings, and see this as something that he did for the sake of others (cf. Col 1:24). He knows that when he suffers for the Gospel, to fulfill the duties of the "divine office" given to him (cf. Col 1:25), he builds up the Body of Christ and becomes a minister of the grace that flows from the Cross. Elsewhere, Paul says, "Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain salvation in Christ Jesus with its eternal glory" (2 Tim 2:10).

In this season of Lent, may we all follow Paul's example, embracing the suffering of the Cross and building each other up as we walk along the way that leads to Easter.

# New Roman Missal

On Sunday, November 27 of this year, Catholics in the United States will begin worshiping with the newly-translated texts of the third edition of the Roman Missal.

During the preparation of the gifts, the bread and wine are brought to the altar. At the same time, another very important event is taking place: a collection. Unfortunately, the collection is often viewed solely as a way for the parish to pay its bills. Too many of us do not see this collection as a spiritual act – as an expression of the way we hope to live the other six days of the week. In the Profession of Faith, we proclaim our belief and our trust in God as the creator of all things. We express our belief that everything we have is a gift from God. Our response is to live as caretakers of God's gifts and to use them wisely for the good of all. Since we ultimately have no ownership of anything but are entrusted with the care of that which belongs to God, we must be good stewards of God's gifts and share generously of our time, talent, and treasure. Jesus was the ultimate steward. He generously gave of himself, sharing with others his gifts of teaching and healing, and moving ultimately to the most unselfish

# What does it mean to "fast" and to "abstain." When do we do these things? Who is required to do them?

To "fast" means, at minimum, eating one regularlysized meal and two smaller meals, with no snacking in between. Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for all Catholics age 18 - 60 yrs old.

To "abstain" is to refrain from eating meat. This abstinence is obligatory on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and every Friday during Lent for all Catholics age 14 and up.

Fifth Sunday in Lent

"Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

# John 11:21;32

Such was Martha's greeting to Jesus when he arrived at Bethany, a small village approximately four miles southeast of Jerusalem. He receives the same greeting from Mary. Their greetings reveal both faith and doubt, faith that Jesus could have prevented the death of Lazarus and doubt that he could now do anything about it. Jesus understood their doubts. If we do not occasionally doubt our faith, we may not have a faith to doubt. Jesus was teaching Martha and Mary what he would later teach Thomas, "Do not persist in your unbelief, but believe" (John 21:27). Jesus uses this whole episode to teach all of us that we must be good stewards of our faith. When we have doubts do we let them linger and fester; or do we try to resolve them by seeking the counsel of our clergy, studying the teachings of our Church, or discuss them with a spiritual director or someone we can trust? If not, we may sink deeper into our doubt and loose our grip on our faith.

Religious Ed does NOT meet today and youth group DOES meet tonight .


Thank for returning your stewardship forms. Just drop them by the office or mail them in as soon as you can.
