

Catholic Q&A

Why do we call priests "father" when Jesus said, "Call no man your father on earth" (Mt 23:9)?

First, we should read the passage in context:

"Then said Jesus to the crowds and to his disciples, 'The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat: so practice and observe whatever they tell you, but not what they do; for they preach, but do not practice. They bind heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with their finger. They do all their deeds to be seen by men; for they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long, and they love the place of honor at feasts and the best seats in the synagogues, and salutations in the market places, and being called rabbi by men. But you are not to be called rabbi, for you have one teacher, and you are all brethren. And call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven. Neither be called masters, for you have one master, the Christ. He who is greatest among you shall be your servant; whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." (Mt 23:1-13)

What this reveals is that Jesus is not railing against fatherhood *per se*. Instead, He is speaking out against those who seek the position of father for the honor that it brings and who, once having the position, don't live it humbly and authentically.

The entire chapter is a rebuke of the pride and hypocrisy of the scribes and Pharisees. Jesus repeats the phrase, "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!" six times in this chapter. It is within this larger rebuke that we find Jesus' words about calling no man rabbi, father, or master. He is using hyperbole, a type of extreme and exaggerated language, in order to emphasize the Fatherhood of God above the fatherhood of any man and to highlight the unworthiness of the scribes and Pharisees to receive the titles their position affords them.

If one takes this passage too literally in order to condemn Catholicism, he finds himself in the awkward position of having to condemn Paul too. After all, Paul addressed his accusers by saying, "Brethren and *fathers*, hear me" (Acts 22:1). He even went a step further and called himself a father to the churches he formed and guided through his letters (cf. 1 Cor 4:15; Phil 2:22; 1 Thes 2:11). They were his "children" (cf. 2 Cor 12:14; 1 Thes 2:11). Timothy was Paul's "beloved son" and "true child in the faith" (1 Cor 4:17; Phil 2:22; 1 Tim 1:2,18; 2 Tim 1:2), as were Titus and Onesimus (cf. Titus 1:4; Philemon 1:10).

Now, considering all this, is Paul forsaking the command of the Lord here, or is he witnessing to a true spiritual fatherhood on earth, the same one that exists between a priest and the faithful? I think the answer is clear.

Roman Catholic Missal

On Sunday, November 27 of this year, Catholics in the United States will begin worshiping with the newly-translated texts of the third edition of the Roman Missal.

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (the first document issued by the 2nd Vatican Council) tells us that "the Church earnestly desires that all the faithful be led to that full, conscious and active participation" in the celebration of the Eucharist and that this "is the aim to be considered before all else." "Active" participation is not the opposite of "contemplative." Some of our activity at liturgy is contemplation. Part of the genius of the Roman rite is that it presumes a beauty on which our spirits can feast. If we have too often seen "active" as "busy," consider the liturgy and see the wealth of silence, as well as the powerful reading of Scripture, and preaching and singing of psalms to engage our contemplation. "Active" participation also calls us to attend to others, to a kind of presence. This is crucial to what Catholic liturgy is all about. We are here not to make our own prayer while each other person in the church at the same time makes his or her own prayer. We are baptized people standing with other baptized people. Additionally, "active" participation means the awareness that at liturgy we never close out the larger world. The liturgy shows us gospel living and how to be in the world. Catholic morality, how we deal in justice and charity day by day with great and small matters, is to be encountered and uncovered from our active participation in the liturgy.

Forming Good Stewards Sunday Collections

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time "But who do you say that I am?" Matthew 13:16-20

It is Peter who responds to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." We tend to take Peter's response for granted. Surely, after all he had heard and seen it was obvious that Jesus was the long awaited Messiah. Before we get to much exercise jumping to conclusions, let us examine the implications of Peter's response. Peter was not just a fisherman. He was in the fishing business with his brother Andrew and Zebedee, father of James and John. Fishing was a relatively lucrative trade. Peter was a substantial member of his community. When Jesus ask "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" other disciples waltz around the question. But when Jesus ask, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answers with a statement of faith that many, particularly the Jewish leaders, considered to be heresy and could put at risk Peter's financial security, his family and his life. Such faith is a gift from God. He wants all of us to have it. But, like Peter, we must choose to accept, proclaim and live our faith.
