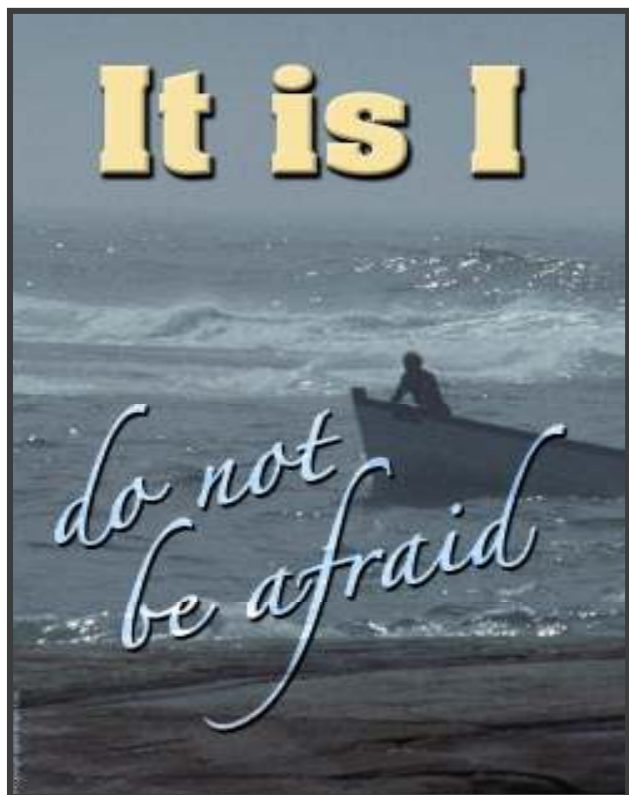

Catholic Q&A

Instead of the usual Q&A, I would like to use this space to let you know about some things I need your help with

The first thing is **Religious Ed**. This is a program for children who belong to the parish but do not go to Catholic schools. It's an opportunity for the parish to supplement what you are doing at home to ensure that our children grow up with a firm grasp of their Catholic faith.

Religious Ed classes are on Sundays during the school year. After the 10 AM Mass, the children and their families gather in the Parish Hall, where they have about 10 or 15 minutes to grab a donut and some juice. Then I dismiss them from there to the various classrooms. Class is from 11:15 AM to Noon. Parents go to the classroom to pick up their children.

The cost is \$50 for one child, \$65 total for two children, and \$75 total for three or more. If you need financial assistance, please let me know. We will make it work.

There are three important items to add to your calendar:

-- **Registration** for Religious Ed is after the 10 AM Mass on Aug. 7, 14, and 21 in the Family Life Center.

-- There is an important **Parent Meeting** on Wed., Sept. 7th in the Family Life Center. We will be going over the calendar for the year and addressing other points of concern for parents.

-- The **first day of class** for the 2011-2012 school year is Sunday, Sept. 11.

The next item of importance is the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, or **RCIA**. This is for any non-Catholic adult who has questions about Catholicism or who might be interested in becoming Catholic. ***I rely on you heavily to bring to me individuals for this process.***

Please take the time, on the way home from Mass today, to consider as a family who you might want to invite to join the RCIA process. You could even make a list of your non-Catholic friends, relatives, and co-workers, and then divide up the names among yourselves. The Holy Spirit could be waiting on you to extend that initial invitation so that He can light that spark of faith that grows into a heart that is burning with love for Christ and His Church.

RCIA begins on Thurs., Sept. 1 at 7 PM in the "Youth Room" in the Family Life Center.

Nineteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time
 "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." Matthew 14:22-33

Fear, disbelief, amazement and reassurance are just some of the emotions the disciples would have experienced when they saw Jesus walking toward their boat on the wind tossed waters of the Sea of Galilee. Peter speaks to the person on the water. Notice he says, "If it is you . . ." Obviously, he is not sure. But at least he has the courage to ask. Then he says, "command me to come to you . . ." Peter hopes it is Jesus, and he may even have believed it was Jesus. He wants to go to Jesus. But he does not want to take the responsibility for stepping out of the boat in the event he is wrong. He wants Jesus to "command" him so if he fails it is Jesus' fault. Before we judge Peter and the other disciples too harshly we should reflect on our reaction when we sense Jesus is calling us, through his presence in the midst of turmoil and uncertainty, to step out of our comfort zone into a strange or risky situation. Do we have the faith, hope and courage to do so without being "commanded" by Jesus? Are we willing to be responsible for our faith?

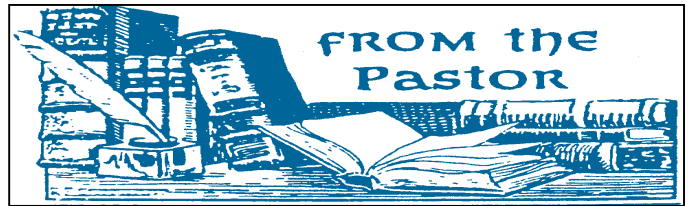

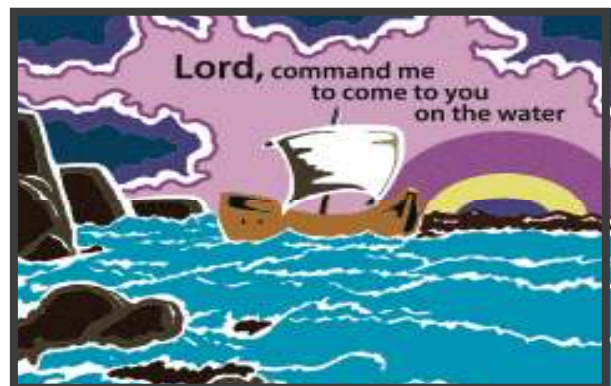
