New Roman Missal

Distractions can make participation and appreciation of the Mass discouraging. Our thoughts stray; we find ourselves trying to solve problems of home, of office, of life in general. The people around us distract us: a crying child; someone with an annoying habit sharing “my” pew; the choir is off-key; the readings can’t be heard-and on and on. There are strategies to reduce the impact of these distractions: 1) Prepare for Mass. Read over that day’s Scriptures. In this way you will have done the “ground work” tilling the soil so that the seed of God’s Word may find ready soil in you. 2) Participate in Mass. Sing the hymns, pray the responses, listen to the readings and to the prayers. Work at doing this well, and there will be less time for distractions. 3) Take daily time to be silent and to listen. The self-discipline of a regular period of quiet reflection teaches us to empty our minds of the cares, ideas, and distracting thoughts that press on us—and to concentrate on God, on His incredible love for me (personally), and His presence to me. 4) Don’t get discouraged. It is the effort that counts. The results are in the hands of God.

Forming Good Stewards Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Blessed are . . .” Matthew 5:1-12

The people gathered on a hillside on the northwestern shore of the Sea of Galilee were probably surprised by the kinds of people Jesus describes after saying “Blessed are . . .” But Jesus is describing characteristics that God intended for all of us to have. Imagine a world in which everyone is poor in spirit, rather than selfishly materialistic; mourns the pain and loss of others, rather than causes it; is meek, rather than proud and boastful; hungers for what is right, rather than ignores or tramples on the rights of others; shows mercy, rather than seeks vengeance; has a pure heart, rather than seeks their own pleasure at the cost of others; makes peace rather than cause conflict; accepts rejection for doing what is right, rather than retaliates against those who do wrong; endures insults and persecution without bitterness, for imitating Jesus. If we all accepted the responsibility to be the person God created us to be, wouldn’t we be blessed?
