

## Catholic Q & A

## What is Vacation Bible School?

Vacation Bible School ("VBS") is typically a week-long program offered during the summer to teach children about their faith in a fun and engaging way. Of course, there is a teaching component, but music, crafts, and games are almost always involved as well. It started out as a Protestant phenomenon, but Catholic churches soon realized that they too could utilize this format to teach children more about Christ and his Church.

Today, there are a wide variety of VBS programs for churches to choose from, but not all of them are Catholic. In fact, the majority of them are not. Even the ones that are often labeled "Catholic" are simply Protestant programs with a few Catechism references thrown in.

There's nothing necessarily wrong with this. A child can learn a lot from a Protestant VBS program and many Catholic parents send their children to local Protestant churches to participate in their programs. But, I prefer to use programs that have a distinctly Catholic message and theme. I think this better serves the mission of the parish to nurture children in their Catholic faith.

In **2009**, we used a program from Cat.Chat entitled, "Marvelous Mystery: The Mass Comes Alive." The children learned about how the Mass is a *mystery*, a *gift*, a *celebration*, a *meal*, and a *call*. There was also a virtue and a saint for each day ... and a new song to sing!

In **2010**, we used another program from Cat.Chat, entitled, "Cool Kingdom Party: Mary Leads Me Closer to Jesus." The children learned about the virtues of **obedience**, **purity**, **faith**, **love**, and **joy** ... and how Mary exemplifies those qualities in a spectacular way. They learned about several of the Marian dogmas, as well as the Kingship of Christ and how they can build His Kingdom.

**This year** we will being using a third Cat.Chat program, entitled, "A Wilderness Adventure Through the Sacraments: Jesus in My Heart." It promises to be just as fun and engaging as the previous two Cat.Chat programs.

If you haven't registered your child yet, it's not too late and now's the time! **VBS 2011 is July 25-29, from 9 AM to noon in the Parish Hall.** You can register after the 10 AM Mass this weekend, or come by the office during office hours.

## **New Roman Missal**

On Sunday, November 27 of this year, Catholics in the United States will begin worshiping with the newly-translated texts of the third edition of the Roman Missal.

When we receive the Eucharist each Sunday at Mass, we are changed. That change does not necessarily result in doing new and different things. Rather, the change is more about doing things for a new and different reason, with a new and different approach, and from a new and different source. When we leave the church after Mass, more deeply aware of our baptismal call to live as disciples of Christ, we need not think that we have to change jobs or speak more religiously on the job. Martin Luther King, Jr. emphasized that it is in our everyday lives that we live out our true calling: "If a man is called to be a street sweeper he should sweep streets even as Michelangelo painted, or Beethoven composed music, or Shakespeare wrote poetry. He should sweep streets so well that all the hosts of heaven and earth will pause to say, here lived a great street sweeper who did his job well." The Eucharist opens our eyes to the reality of God's presence above us, below us, in front of us, behind us, and all around us. As baptized followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to revealing this reality to others in a myriad of ordinary ways each and every day.

## Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time "If you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until the harvest." Mt 13:44-52

Jesus knew his followers would live in a world that is full of temptations - to do evil, to take the easy way out, to take advantage of others to gain wealth and power. He knew we would be challenged to abandon our efforts to know Him and to imitate Him to the best of our ability. Jesus also knew that one of God's greatest gifts to us is free will - the ability to choose between good and evil, to choose between doing right and doing wrong, to choose between being generous and being selfish. But Jesus taught us by word and deed that being his follower - a Christian - is not about feeling good, it is about doing good. It is not about looking right; it is about doing right. It is not about how much we acquire for ourselves, it is about how much we share with others. God creates us in this world with many temptations so we could demonstrate our love for him by seeking to discern His will and choosing to do His will. Our God is an awesome God!


