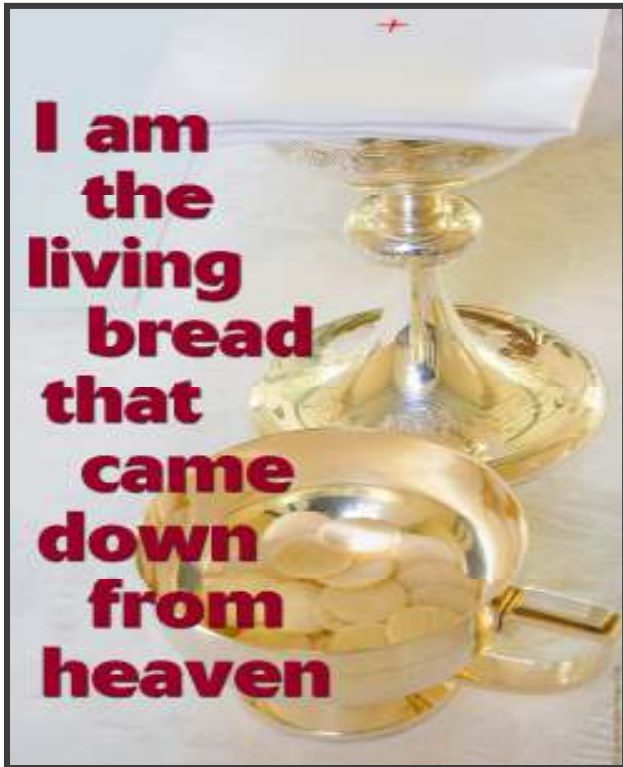

Catholic Q & A

Does the Bible say anything about bread and wine becoming the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ?

Yes, it does! In John 6, Jesus unceasingly demands this understanding of the Eucharist:

-- "...the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." (vs. 51)

-- "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you;" (vs. 53)

-- "he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day." (vs. 54)

-- "For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed." (vs. 55)

-- "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." (vs. 56)

-- "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me." (vs. 57)

The crowd obviously understood Jesus to be speaking literally. They disputed among themselves, objecting to such a "hard saying" (cf. vs. 52, 60). They could not understand how Jesus could give of Himself to eat without flinging the people into cannibalism. Those who remained with Jesus even though they did not understand would come to see how Jesus makes this happen. The eating and drinking of Christ would be **sacramental**, in which outward signs communicate an inward reality.

Dining with His apostles on the night before He died, Jesus said of the bread, "Take, eat, **this is my body**," and of the wine, "Drink of it, all of you, for **this is my blood of the covenant**" (Mt 26:26-27). The bread **is** His Body, the wine **is** His Blood. After this he told the Apostles, "Do this in remembrance of me," commissioning them to do what every priest does when he makes Christ substantially present in the Mass.

St. Paul confirms this understanding of the Eucharist as **truly Christ** when he says that the bread and the wine are a participation in the Body and Blood of Christ (cf. 1 Cor 10:16). He goes on to say that whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of **profaning the body and blood of the Lord**, and that anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself (cf. 1 Cor 11:27-29). This can only be if the bread and wine are the actual Body and Blood of Christ.

The Eucharist is truly an amazing gift.

“Who Lied”

The following Sunday, as he prepared to deliver his sermon, the minister asked for a show of hands. He wanted to know how many had read Mark 17.

Every hand went up. The Minister said “that is interesting,” as he looked over the crowd, “Mark only has 16 chapters, so now I will proceed with my sermon on the sin of lying!!”

New Roman Missal

On Sunday, November 27 of this year, Catholics in the United States will begin worshiping with the newly-translated texts of the third edition of the Roman Missal.

The Concluding Rite of the Mass consists of the greeting (“The Lord be with You” “And with your spirit”), the priest’s blessing (“May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit”) and the dismissal. In the current Roman Missal, the dismissal may take one of three forms. The deacon or the priest may say: “Go in the peace of Christ,” or “The Mass is ended, go in peace,” or “Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.” The newly revised Roman Missal (which we begin using later this year) will provide four options for the dismissal. The priest or deacon may say: “Go forth, the Mass is ended,” or “Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord,” or “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life,” or “Go in peace.” Our response remains: “Thanks be to God.” The Holy Father himself added the last three options in an effort to remind us that our work is just beginning when we leave the celebration of the Eucharist. We are being given a mission to carry the Gospel with us and to be bearers of Christ to the world.

Forming Good Stewards Sunday Collections

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ
“The bread I will give you is my flesh for the life of the world.” John 6:51

These were very disturbing words for the Jews, who asked, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” Before we judge them too harshly, we should remember that we have the witness of two thousand years of Christians who had great devotion and sacrificed much, often their lives, for their faith in the Real Presence of Jesus. For the Jews listening to Jesus this was a strange concept that produced grotesque images. Today, many Jews, non-Catholic Christians, and non-Christians no longer question our belief in Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Some wish to share in our Communion. They appreciate the privilege we have of receiving Christ in His Body and in His Blood, so that we may be strengthened to be His Body and Blood for others in our world. Do we truly appreciate that privilege and are we good stewards of the Body and Blood of Jesus that we receive?

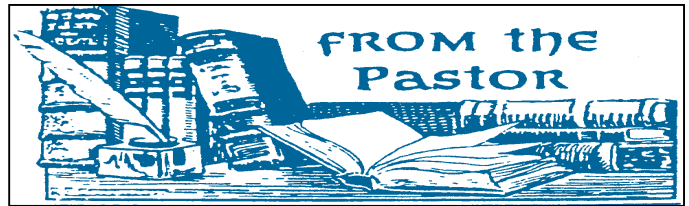
