

## Catholic Q & A

### What is the RCIA Process?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process, established for the universal Church, for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church.

The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

The RCIA process is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church (cf. *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, no. 64).

There are four periods or stages to the RCIA process:

<u>Precatechumenate</u>: This is a time for inquiry and evangelization, an opportunity for the beginnings of faith. Here the seed is planted through the proclamation of the Gospel and the story of salvation history.

<u>Catechumenate</u>: This is an extended period for pastoral formation and guidance aimed at training participants in the Christian life; it includes a thoroughly comprehensive catechesis on the truths of Catholic doctrine and morality.

<u>Purification and Enlightenment</u>: Coinciding with Lent, this period consists more in interior reflection than in instruction. It is intended to enlighten the minds and hearts of participants with a deep knowledge of Christ.

Mystagogy: This time of post-baptismal catechesis extends through the Easter season, the seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. It is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth, and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community.

## The New Translation - The Mystery of Faith

On Sunday, November 27of this year, Catholics in the United States will begin worshiping with the newly-translated texts of the third edition of the Roman Missal.

For Catholics, a 'mystery' is not a puzzle that cannot be solved. It is a truth that is so deep that we know we'll never be able to get to the bottom of it; a truth we'll never completely be able to understand. One example of this is our belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We believe that Christ is truly present but we can't wholly explain it. The priest shows us the host and then the chalice. Then he genuflects and says 'The mystery of faith'. We continue with one of three responses. These are all different from the ones we have been used to and they come directly from the New Testament. So when the priest says 'The mystery of faith' he is inviting us to welcome this Real Presence of Christ. We then make our response, which we address to God.

## Forming Good Stewards Sunday Collections

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
"Am I not free to do as I wish with my own money?
Are you envious because I am generous?'
Gospel Mt 20:1-16a

A TV commercial depicts a mom using the last two pieces of bread to make a sandwich for two boys. She tells one boy that he can cut the sandwich in half and he gets excited. After he cuts the sandwich she says that the other boy will get to choose which half he wants. Our attitude about what is just is often influenced by the impact such justice will have on us. In the Gospel story about the landowner and the workers it is probably natural for us to side with the workers who started first. But justice is not about how much we receive or have in comparison to others. It is about what we do with what we receive, regardless of what others do or fail to do. God made us stewards and caretakers of all that we are, all that we have and all that we ever will be. He also made us stewards of justice in the use of the things over which we have control. Happily, we are not responsible for what God has given to others, except to give them a good example of how to act justly by imitating Jesus.
