

Catholic Q&A

Why are there so many different versions of the bible? There are even different Catholic versions!

Short answer: Because not all bibles have the same list of books, because there are different ways to translate the text, and because translators don't always have the same manuscripts at their disposal.

Long answer: There are three reasons for this. First, Protestant bibles don't have the same list of books that Catholic bibles have. Specifically, they lack 7 books from the Old Testament: Tobit, Judith, Wisdom, Sirach, Baruch, and 1st and 2nd Maccabees (as well as portions of Esther and Daniel). The Protestant reformers removed these books when they left the Catholic Church in the 1500's. So, this is why you have "Protestant" and "Catholic" versions of the bible.

Secondly, translators don't always agree on the best way to translate the Bible. Some prefer a literal translation, where every word is translated into the English word that directly corresponds to it. Others prefer a "dynamic equivalence" translation, where sentences are paraphrased in order to communicate their overall meaning and to increase readability. Even among these two groups, there are differences of opinion regarding the best way to render a word or paraphrase a sentence.

Finally, the various English versions of the bible also differ based on the manuscripts and source material that were used. For example, the Douay-Rheims version is an English translation of the Latin Vulgate, which was St. Jerome's Latin translation of the original Greek and Hebrew. The King James version is largely a revision of an earlier English translation called *The Bishop's Bible*, with the original Hebrew and Greek consulted when necessary. Newer English versions, such as the New International Version and the New American Bible, benefit from the Greek and Hebrew manuscripts found among the Dead Sea Scrolls, whereas translators of the older versions did not have these at their disposal.

All of this comes together to contribute to the great number of English versions of the Bible that we have today. As a Catholic, the best thing to do is to have several Catholic translations available. Choose one that you like the best and use that as the bible you turn to the most, but have the other ones on hand in case you want to further investigate a passage. A lot of times, one translation will reveal a new meaning to a passage that another version does not, because it is translated differently.

Some Catholic translations also contain commentary and footnotes at the bottom, apologetical or devotional inserts, and even dictionaries or concordances in the back. The presence of these tools will effect your decision as well. Whichever one you choose, read it zealously!

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 4:21-30

And Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own native place."

If we become a star athlete or acquire great wealth our high school or home town may honor us as "Person of the Year" or dedicate a plaque to us. But if we challenge people to do great things, there may be no plaque for us. Jesus entered the synagogue in his home town of Nazareth and read a passage from Isaiah that prophesied the coming of the Messiah and then He said it had been fulfilled in their midst. The people of Nazareth knew Jesus well. He grew up and lived among them. He was one of them. He was like them. He had not yet done anything to indicate that He was the Messiah. But the people knew the Messiah would do great things. If Jesus was the Messiah, there was no reason why they, too, could not do great things. If Jesus could not prove to them that He was the Messiah, there would be no pressure on them to be better than they wanted to be. Jesus knew that familiarity breeds doubt. He challenged the people of Nazareth to accept Him despite their doubt - to have faith in Him. Do we sometimes doubt Jesus? Do we accept Him as Messiah despite our doubt? Do we have faith in Him?

As you are looking for items to donate, remember the following food guidelines:

look for items that are "low-calorie", "low-soodum", and "sugar-free"; canned chicken, tuna and salmon are good sources of protein; all canned vegetables and sauces should be "low-sodium", or labelled as "no salt-added"; 100% whole grain pasta, brown rice, rolled oats, wild rice, and whole grain crackers are best; canned fruit needs to be "without sugar added" as well as no corn syrup or artificial sweeteners; low sodium soups, broths; unsalted nuts; no sugar added jams and jellies; and no-salt seasoning (like Mrs. Dash) can naturally flavor meals

Hopefully as you are shopping, you can find ways to place healthier items into your **OWN** pantry as well as the pantry that so many others in our area are dependent upon.
