

Catholic Q & A

With the feasts of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day coming up on Nov. 1st and 2nd, I thought it would be appropriate to reprint an early column on praying to the saints.

Where does Scripture say that we can pray to the saints in heaven?

There is no passage that explicitly states, "You may pray to the saints in heaven." But, we do have examples of people crying out to the angels and the hosts of heaven (cf. Psa 103:20-21; 148:2; Dan 3:58, 61), which is basically the same thing as praying to them.

But, let's say, for some reason, a person does not accept those examples. I think praying to the saints also follows logically from what Scripture says about the Body of Christ and the activity of the angels and saints in heaven.

First of all, the bible tells us that the saints are alive and full members of the Body of Christ. Jesus was able to call the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob a God "of the living" (cf. Mt 22:32) because Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob were still alive, with God, in heaven. Death does not separate us from the love of God (cf. Rom 8:38-39). Furthermore, by holding fast to the Head the whole Body is joined and nourished and knit together (cf. Eph 2:20-21; 4:15-16; Col 2:18--19). God's "plan for the fullness of time" is "to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth" (Eph 1:9-10). This means that the saints in heaven are just as much members of the Body of Christ as you and I are. If I can ask you to pray for me, then I can ask St. Joseph to pray for me too.

Secondly, we see that those who go to heaven still care for us and are aware of our needs. Why else would there be joy among the angels in heaven over even one repentant sinner? (cf. Lk 15:7, 10). We are "a spectacle" to them (1 Cor 4:9). The virtuous men and women who have gone before us make up "a great cloud of witnesses" that surrounds us as we run with perseverance the race that is set before us (Heb 12:1).

Thirdly, not only do the saints care about what happens to the Church on earth, they are also doing something about it! As members of the Body of Christ, they intercede for us. That's just what you do (cf. 1 Tim 2:1), and there's no reason to believe that a righteous person would relinquish this duty once he got to heaven. In fact, we see that the saints continue to intercede for us and to take our needs to God, just as you have often prayed for people.

For example, in the Book of Job, we see an angel asking the Lord to deliver man from death and return him to his youthful vigor (cf. 33:23-26). The Lord Himself told Jeremiah about how Moses and Samuel (who were long since dead) pleaded with Him on behalf of the people (cf. Jer 15:1). An angel lamented to the Lord that He had yet to show mercy to Jerusalem and the cities of Judah (cf. Zech 1:12). The martyrs in heaven cry out to God to judge and seek vengeance upon those who take the lives of God's faithful people (cf. Rev 6:9-11). In heaven, the angels and saints offer our prayers to God like incense (cf. Rev 5:8; 8:3-4).

Finally, we can and should pray to the saints because it gives glory to God. The saints would not be in heaven, nor would they remain members of the Body of Christ, were it not for what Christ did in their lives and in ours to unite all things in Himself.

Forming Good Stewards Sunday Collections

Luke 16:19-31

"Abraham told the rich man, 'My child, remember you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad.""

Jesus paints a depressing picture of Lazarus, a poor man covered with sores laying at the door of a rich man who obviously ignored the poor man just outside of his house. Both men die. From the netherworld [hell] the rich man sees Lazarus in the bosom of Abraham [where all Jews hope to be when they die]. The rich man had clearly ignored the Word that God gave Moses to reveal to the Israelites: to love our neighbor as ourselves. Lazarus, laying outside the rich man's house was clearly his neighbor. He was obviously in need of love and care. But the rich man ignored him. He did not love Lazarus as he loved himself. He did not even love him enough to provide him with the basic necessities of life. Jesus uses this graphic story to teach us that our neighbors can be just outside our door or across the street. In our current age of instantaneous global communications, our neighbors are all over the world. And many of them are in the same condition as Lazarus. Will we love and help them before it is too late for us?
