

From the office of the Bishop:

Fr. Freddie Byrd, a priest of the Diocese of Owensboro, has been reinstated to his position as pastor of St. Ann Church in Morganfield, Kentucky by Bishop William F. Medley, the Bishop of Owensboro. On June 8, 2016 Fr. Byrd had been temporarily suspended from public ministry following an allegation that he had engaged in inappropriate conduct with a minor in 1983, five years before he was ordained to the priesthood. Bishop Medley issued this suspension after consultation with the Diocesan Review Board, a consultative board comprised of educators, psychologists, attorneys, law enforcement personnel, and children's advocates.

Earlier in his priesthood Fr. Byrd had served at the following parishes in the Diocese of Owensboro: St. Stephen Cathedral and Blessed Sacrament Chapel, Owensboro [June 1988-June 1990], Dean of Students at Owensboro Catholic High School, Owensboro [May 1988- June 1990], Blessed Mother Parish, Owensboro [June 1990-June 1992], Sts. Joseph and Paul Parish, Owensboro [June 1997-June 1998], Blessed Mother Parish [June 998-June 2008], St. Peter of Antioch and Sacred Heart Parishes, Waverly [June 2008-June 2012].

On September 14, 2016 the Diocesan Review Board further explored the information that has been compiled and counseled the bishop that there was insufficient information to substantiate the allegation.

Because the Church's first obligation with regard to all victims, whether alleged or substantiated, is for healing and reconciliation, the Diocese will reach out to every person who alleges that he or she was abused by anyone acting in the name of the Church, whether the alleged abuse was recent or occurred many years in the past. Forming Good Stewards Sunday Collections

Luke 16:19-31

"Abraham told the rich man, 'My child, remember you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad."

Jesus paints a depressing picture of Lazarus, a poor man covered with sores laying at the door of a rich man who obviously ignored the poor man just outside of his house. Both men die. From the netherworld [hell] the rich man sees Lazarus in the bosom of Abraham [where all Jews hope to be when they die]. The rich man had clearly ignored the Word that God gave Moses to reveal to the Israelites: to love our neighbor as ourselves. Lazarus, laying outside the rich man's house was clearly his neighbor. He was obviously in need of love and care. But the rich man ignored him. He did not love Lazarus as he loved himself. He did not even love him enough to provide him with the basic necessities of life. Jesus uses this graphic story to teach us that our neighbors can be just outside our door or across the street. In our current age of instantaneous global communications, our neighbors are all over the world. And many of them are in the same condition as Lazarus. Will we love and help them before it is too late for us?
